

Today's Meditation

In this gospel reading, we hear Jesus telling us to be watchful and to be alert for His coming. We know He had already come more than two thousand years ago but before He went back to His Father on Ascension Day, He promised that He would come back but He did not mention the day or time. Yet we may not be alive when He comes back. For our life on earth is only temporary. Sooner or later, we will leave our earthly body and go to the other world. That is why there is a really a need to prepare for any eventuality. In other words, whether we



are alive when Jesus comes again or we die today or tomorrow, we must be ready to meet Him face to face.

So let's get familiar with Jesus now. It is not yet too late. Let's know Him and His precepts for it will be an anomaly if we have heard of Him but refuse to believe and follow Him.
