

**BAPTISM:** Parents must attend a preparation class prior to having their child baptized. Please schedule an appointment with Father Roger to discuss the procedure.


**<u>RECONCILIATION</u>**: Immediately following Mass and by appointment.

# Today's Meditation

The gospel reading today offers a multifaceted look at Jesus' early ministry, emphasizing compassion, service, the need for prayer and solitude, and a focused mission. It provides a template not only for understanding Jesus' work but also for guiding our own lives, balancing service with spiritual sustenance.

There are several lessons that we can learn from this short passage. We see Jesus attending to the needs of individuals like the mother-in-law of Peter, showing that no act of care is too small for His attention. We also witness how the people of the whole town came to Him in the evening to seek healing and freedom from demonic possession. This shows the growing impact of His ministry and the variety of needs He addressed, from physical ailments to spiritual oppression. When He went to a deserted place to pray in the next morning, He indicated the importance of solitude, prayer, and communion with the Father, especially in the midst of busy ministry. It shows that the source of His strength and guidance comes from these moments of solitude.

Finally, when His disciples find Him and tell Him everyone is searching for Him, Jesus responds by saying it's time to move to the next towns to preach there also. This indicates a clear sense of mission and purpose. Jesus understands that His message is not just for one group or place but needs to be spread



widely (a sense of mission and purpose).

Today, we should be inspired to balance active service with periods of rest and reflection. We should be encouraged to response with compassion to the needs around us while grounding our actions in spiritual practice and a clear sense of purpose.
